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Sam and Georgie Pearman's Swan Inn in the chocolate box village of Ascottunder-Wychwood is all our cottagecore dreams come true, with roaring fires, exposed stone walls, and floral prints for days. Locals and Londoners, young and old, love it and will be huddling happily together under the stretch tent in the courtyard at every opportunity.

The food finds the sweet spot between dad-friendly pub grub and contemporary locavorism, with toad-in-the-hole and double beef burgers alongside healthy grain bowls, BBQ prawns and Chipping Norton sourdough, and Banbury cake and Westcombe cheddar.
